




## Welcome

Welcome to *Don't Sleep There Are Snakes!* This play is based on the story of my thirty years of research among the Pirahã people of the Brazilian Amazon. When I was a young man, alone with my family in the jungle all those years ago, I used to read to my children, Shannon, Kristene, and Caleb, by kerosene lamp, as the frogs croaked, the owls hooted, the water gurgled, and jaguars occasionally roared at the river's edge a mile or so away. We used to stop our reading to listen to Pirahãs conversing all around our small, thatched-roof house on stilts. And it was amazing to us all that we had the privilege of being where we were.



I never imagined back then that I would write a book about these experiences. Much less did I ever dream that some day a play about these experiences would premier in London. I suspect that I shall enjoy this play because I am still alive and because others might enjoy life more learning about the Pirahãs. Thanks to simple8 for taking on this project. And thank you for sharing this experience. How marvelous is the unpredictability of life.




